RESOLUTION NO. 2007-115 OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO ORDER THE ANNEXATION OF STREET LIGHTING ZONE 66 TO LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICT NO. 89-1-CONSOLIDATED OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE PURSUANT TO THE LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING ACT OF 1972 FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND SERVICING OF STREETS/LIGHTS; ADOPTING THE PRELIMINARY ENGINEER'S REPORT, GIVING NOTICE OF AND SETTING THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE ANNEXATION OF STREET LIGHTING ZONE 66; ORDERING AN ASSESSMENT PROCEEDING; ORDERING A MAILED BALLOT ELECTION; AND DIRECTING NOTICE OF THE PUBLIC HEARING AND THE ASSESSMENT BALLOT TO BE MAILED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIII(D) OF THE CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION AND SECTION 4000 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (hereinafter the "Board of Supervisors") of the County of Riverside (hereinafter the "County") has adopted Resolution No. 2007-110 on April 3, 2007 initiating proceedings for the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66 (hereinafter "Street Lighting Zone 66"), as described and shown in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, to Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 89-1-Consolidated of the County of Riverside, State of California, (hereinafter "L&LM No. 89-1-C") pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (hereinafter the "Act"), which is Part 2 (commencing with Section 22500) of Division 15 of the Streets and Highways Code (hereinafter the "Street and Highways Code"), and ordering the preparation of a report (hereinafter the "Report") regarding the proposed annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66 and the assessments to be levied within Street Lighting Zone 66 each fiscal year beginning fiscal year 2007/08 for providing electricity for streetlights within the public right-of-way within said Zone; and

WHEREAS, such proceedings shall comply with the requirements of Article XIII(D) of the California Constitution (hereinafter "Article XIII(D)"), the Act, and Section 4000 of the Elections Code requiring voter approval of the proposed assessment to be levied by L&LM No. 89-1-C for Street Lighting Zone 66; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors by Resolution No. 2007-114 directed the Director of the Transportation Department, or his designee (hereinafter the "Engineer"), to prepare and file the Report with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in accordance with Sections 22608 and 22585 et. seq. of the Street and Highways Code and Section 4 of Article XIII(D); and

WHEREAS, said Engineer has filed the Report with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and the Report has been presented to and considered by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the sole owner of property within the proposed boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 66 as the applicant (the "Applicant") for these proceedings has executed a "Waiver and Consent Regarding Date of Assessment Ballot Election" allowing for the election to be held on June 5, 2007; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution of intention pursuant to Section 22624 of the Streets and Highways Code, which fixes and gives notice, pursuant to Section 22626 of the Streets and Highways Code, of the time and place of a public hearing on said Report, the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66, and the assessments to be levied on parcels within Street Lighting Zone 66 beginning in fiscal year 2007/08;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors in regular session assembled on April 3, 2007 as follows:

Section 1. Findings. The Board of Supervisors, after reviewing the Report, finds that: (a) The foregoing recitals are true and correct; (b) The Report contains all matters required by Sections 22565 through 22574 of the Streets and Highways Code and Section 4 of Article XIII(D) and may, therefore, be approved by the Board of Supervisors; (c) The annual assessment for fiscal year 2007/08 on all parcels within Street Lighting Zone 66 proposed to be annexed to L&LM No. 89-1-C will be \$326.74 per acre.

Section 2. Intent. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares its intention to order the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66, as described and shown in Exhibit "A", to L&LM No. 89-1-C, and to levy and collect an annual assessment on all assessable lots and parcels of property within Street Lighting Zone 66 commencing with the fiscal year 2007/08 as set forth in the Report. The Report expressly states that there are no parcels or lots within Street Lighting Zone 66 that are owned by a federal, state or other local governmental agency that will benefit from the services to be financed by the annual assessments. The annual assessments will be collected at the same time and in the same manner as property taxes are collected, and all laws providing for the collection and enforcement of property taxes shall apply to the collection and enforcement of said assessments.

Section 3. Boundaries. All the property within boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 66 is proposed to be annexed into L&LM No. 89-1-C and shall include that property in the unincorporated area of the County as described and shown in Exhibit "A".

Section 4. Description of Services to be Provided. The service authorized for Street Lighting Zone 66 of L&LM No. 89-1-C is the provision of electricity to all streetlights within the public right-of-way including incidental costs and expenses.

Section 5. Amount to be Levied. The assessment to be levied upon each parcel that benefits from the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66 of L&LM No. 89-1-C will be \$326.74 per acre for fiscal year 2007/08. As stated in the Report, the total budget for Street Lighting Zone 66 for the fiscal year 2007/08 is \$660,000; there is 1 parcel that is to be assessed that aggregates to 6.45 acres. The annual assessment will be increased by the greater of two percent (2.0%) or the cumulative percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers ("CPI-U") for "electricity" for the Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County California Standard Metropolitan Statistical area ("index") published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor. The annual CPI-U adjustment will be based on the cumulative increase, if any, in the index as it stands on March 31 of each year over the base index for March of 2007. Any increase larger than the greater of 2.0% or the CPI-U annual adjustment requires a majority approval of all the property owners within Street Lighting Zone 66. The Board of Supervisors will levy the assessment in each subsequent fiscal year until the Board of Supervisors undertakes proceedings for the dissolution of Street Lighting Zone 66 of L&LM No. 89-1-C. The annual assessment will fund the services described in Section 4 of this Resolution. For further particulars, reference is to be made to the Report on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

Section 6. The Property to be Annexed. The property to be annexed into L&LM No. 89-1-C is Street Lighting Zone 66. The boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 66 are located within the unincorporated area of the County and are described and shown in the Report and Exhibit "A".

Section 7. Report. The Report, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and which has been presented to the Board of Supervisors, is hereby approved. Reference is made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the services, the boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 66, and the annual assessment to be levied upon assessable lots and parcels within Street Lighting Zone 66 proposed to be annexed to L&LM No. 89-1-C.

Section 8. Public Hearing. The question of whether Street Lighting Zone 66 shall be annexed into L&LM No. 89-1-C and an annual assessment levied beginning with fiscal year 2007/08 shall be considered at a public hearing (hereinafter the "Public Hearing") to be held on June 5, 2007, at 9:30 a.m. at the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors of the County at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

Section 9. Majority Protest. Each owner of record of property within Street Lighting Zone 66 is to receive by mail an assessment ballot that shall conform to the requirements of Section 4 of Article XIII(D) and Section 4000 of the California Elections Code. The assessment ballots are to be returned prior to the Public Hearing. L&LM No. 89-1-C shall not impose assessments on property within the boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 66 if there is a majority protest with regard to the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66. A majority protest exists if, upon the conclusion of the Public Hearing, the tabulation of the assessment ballots submitted in opposition to the annexation and assessment of Street Lighting Zone 66 exceeds the assessment ballots in favor of the annexation and assessment of Street Lighting Zone 66.

Section 10. Information. Any property owner desiring additional information regarding Street Lighting Zone 66 of L&LM No. 89-1-C, the Report, or the proposed assessment is to contact Ms. Judy A. Section 11. Notice of the Public Hearing. Notice of Public Hearing with regard to the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 66 to L&LM No. 89-1-C shall be given consistent with Section 22626 of the Streets and Highways Code and Section 4 of Article XIII(D). The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall give notice of the Public Hearing by causing a certified copy of this Resolution to be published once in The Press Enterprise at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the Public Hearing that is June 5, 2007. Publication of this Resolution is to be effected by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. Notice shall also be given by mailing first-class, postage prepaid, those notices, as prepared by County Counsel, assessment ballot and information sheets as required by Section 4 of Article XIII(D) and Section 4000 of the California Elections Code to all owners of record of property within Street Lighting Zone 66 as shown on the last equalized assessment roll of the County. Mailing is to be made by the Engineer and deposited with the U. S. Post Office at least forty-five (45) days prior to the Public Hearing on June 5, 2007.

The Board of Supervisors, after reviewing the Report, finds that: (a) The foregoing recitals are true and correct; (b) The Report contains all matters required by Sections 22565 through 22574 of the Streets and Highways Code and Section 4 of Article XIII(D) and may, therefore, be approved by the Board of Supervisors; (c) The annual assessment for fiscal year 2007/08 on all parcels within Street Lighting Zone 62 proposed to be annexed to L&LM No. 89-1-C will be \$159.44 per acre.

Section 2. Intent. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares its intention to order the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 62, as described and shown in Exhibit "A", to L&LM No. 89-1-C, and to levy and collect an annual assessment on all assessable lots and parcels of property within Street Lighting Zone 62 commencing with the fiscal year 2007/08 as set forth in the Report. The Report expressly states that there are no parcels or lots within Street Lighting Zone 62 that are owned by a federal, state or other local governmental agency that will benefit from the services to be financed by the annual assessments. The annual assessments will be collected at the same time and in the same manner as property taxes are collected, and all laws providing for the collection and enforcement of property taxes shall apply to the collection and enforcement of said assessments.

Section 3. Boundaries. All the property within boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 62 is proposed to be annexed into L&LM No. 89-1-C and shall include that property in the unincorporated area of the County as described and shown in Exhibit "A".

Section 4. Description of Services to be Provided. The service authorized for Street Lighting Zone 62 of L&LM No. 89-1-C is the provision of electricity to all streetlights within the public right-of-way including incidental costs and expenses.

Section 5. Amount to be Levied. The assessment to be levied upon each parcel that benefits from the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 62 of L&LM No. 89-1-C will be \$159.44 per acre for fiscal year 2007/08. As stated in the Report, the total budget for Street Lighting Zone 62 for the fiscal year 2007/08 is \$660,000; there is 1 parcel that is to be assessed that aggregates to 4.14 acres. The annual assessment will be increased by the greater of two percent (2.0%) or the cumulative percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers ("CPI-U") for "electricity" for the Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County California Standard Metropolitan Statistical area ("index") published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor. The annual CPI-U adjustment will be based on the cumulative increase, if any, in the index as it stands on March 31 of each year over the base index for March of 2007. Any increase larger than the greater of 2.0% or the CPI-U annual adjustment requires a majority approval of all the property owners within Street Lighting Zone 62. The Board of Supervisors will levy the assessment in each subsequent fiscal year until the Board of Supervisors undertakes proceedings for the dissolution of Street Lighting Zone 62 of L&LM No. 89-1-C. The annual assessment will fund the services described in Section 4 of this Resolution. For further particulars, reference is to be made to the Report on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

Section 6. The Property to be Annexed. The property to be annexed into L&LM No. 89-1-C is Street Lighting Zone 62. The boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 62 are located within the unincorporated area of the County and are described and shown in the Report and Exhibit "A".

Section 7. Report. The Report, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and which has been presented to the Board of Supervisors, is hereby approved. Reference is made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the services, the boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 62, and the annual assessment to be levied upon assessable lots and parcels within Street Lighting Zone 62 proposed to be annexed to L&LM No. 89-1-C.

Section 8. Public Hearing. The question of whether Street Lighting Zone 62 shall be annexed into L&LM No. 89-1-C and an annual assessment levied beginning with fiscal year 2007/08 shall be considered at a public hearing (hereinafter the "Public Hearing") to be held on June 5, 2007, at 9:30 a.m. at the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors of the County at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

Section 9. Majority Protest. Each owner of record of property within Street Lighting Zone 62 is to receive by mail an assessment ballot that shall conform to the requirements of Section 4 of Article XIII(D) and Section 4000 of the California Elections Code. The assessment ballots are to be returned prior to the Public Hearing. L&LM No. 89-1-C shall not impose assessments on property within the boundaries of Street Lighting Zone 62 if there is a majority protest with regard to the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 62. A majority protest exists if, upon the conclusion of the Public Hearing, the tabulation of the assessment ballots submitted in opposition to the annexation and assessment of Street Lighting Zone 62 exceeds the assessment ballots in favor of the annexation and assessment of Street Lighting Zone 62.

Section 10. Information. Any property owner desiring additional information regarding Street Lighting Zone 62 of L&LM No. 89-1-C, the Report, or the proposed assessment is to contact Ms. Judy A. Waterford, Technical Engineering Unit Supervisor, Transportation Department of the County of Riverside, 4080 Lemon Street, 8th Floor, Riverside, California, 92501 or by telephone at (951) 955-6829.

Section 11. Notice of the Public Hearing. Notice of Public Hearing with regard to the annexation of Street Lighting Zone 62 to L&LM No. 89-1-C shall be given consistent with Section 22626 of the Streets and Highways Code and Section 4 of Article XIII(D). The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall give notice of the Public Hearing by causing a certified copy of this Resolution to be published once in The Press Enterprise at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the Public Hearing that is June 5, 2007. Publication of this Resolution is to be effected by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. Notice shall also be given by mailing first-class, postage prepaid, those notices, as prepared by County Counsel, assessment ballot and information sheets as required by Section 4 of Article XIII(D) and Section 4000 of the California Elections Code to all owners of record of property within Street Lighting Zone 62 as shown on the last equalized assessment roll of the County. Mailing is to be made by the Engineer and deposited with the U. S. Post Office at least forty-five (45) days prior to the Public Hearing on June 5, 2007.

Section 12. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its date of adoption.
